

Manitoba Cycling Association Inc. Respect in Sport Policy

Purpose of the Policy:

- Manitoba Cycling Association Inc. is committed to creating a sport environment in which all individuals are treated with respect and dignity. Coaches have a responsibility to create a sporting environment that is free of harassment and abuse.
- Manitoba Cycling Association Inc. requires that all coaches participating in MCA programming complete the <u>Respect in Sport</u> (RIS) and maintain certified status (5 year term) as required by Sport Manitoba and Manitoba Cycling.

Scope and Application:

- 1. The policy applies to all coaches registered with; or named on an official sport roster; or under the jurisdiction of Manitoba Cycling Association Inc.
- 2. Any coach not having completed the RIS program or maintained certified status in the timeframe established by Sport Manitoba and Manitoba Cycling Association Inc.may be removed as a coach until such time that the RIS course is completed and/or maintain RIS certification.

Enforcement:Non-compliance of this policy may result in further discipline as determined by the MCA Board of Directors or in accordance with Manitoba Cycling Association Inc. policy.

Review and Approval:This policy requires the approved of the MCA Board of Directors and will be reviewed by the MCA Executive Committee on an annual basis.
